

CHAPTER 3

ANALYSIS

In this chapter, the study analyzes Albus as the main character in the play. This chapter explains about the data based on the research problems stated in the first chapter. The data are including in the narration of the play and also from dialogue or conversations among the characters. First is examining the experience on Albus perspective, and then the second is going to the influence of Albus experience into his character.

3.1. Albus Potter's Experience

To analyze the experience of Albus, this study divides the experience into three points. The first point is Albus' experience as a Harry's son, it shows the relation between him and his family, especially his dad. The second point is his experience as a student in Hogwarts, it reveals how he studies there and how the surroundings treat him. The third point is his experience as a friend, it explains about how the relation between Albus and his friends.

3.1.1. The Experience as Harry Potter's Son

This play tells about Albus' experience started from the first time he goes to Hogwarts School. He departs with his father, Harry, and his mother, Ginny, his brother James, and his sister Lily. The case is explained in the quotation below:

HARRY: Albus Severus, you were named after two headmasters of Hogwarts. One of them was a Slytherin and he was probably the bravest man I ever knew. (Rowling 4)

From this quotation, it can be understood that Albus is afraid if he will belong to Slytherin dormitory because from his perspective, Slytherin is the worst dormitory in Hogwarts that he cannot be a brave wizard like his family are. On the other hand, for Harry, it does not matter what dormitory will be put for Albus. He makes sure that Slytherin is not like what Albus thinks, even he says that one of Potter's family is a bravest man from Slytherin.

As a Harry Potter's Son, of course Albus brings his father's name too. People in Hogwarts always look on Albus as the same as His father. They assume that all of the Potter's children are having the same things like his father.

Initially we're inside Hogwarts, in the Great Hall, and everyone is dancing around ALBUS.

POLLY CHAPMAN: Albus Potter.

KARL JENKINS: A Potter. In our year.

YANN FREDERICKS: He's got his hair. He's got hair just like him. (Rowling 11).

From quotation above, it can be known that people in Hogwarts School glad with the coming of Albus. They try to compare Albus with Harry even in their physically.

On the third year of Albus study in Hogwarts, he starts to hate everything that related to Hogwarts. It is shows in the data below:

HARRY: Third year. Big year. Here is your permission form for Hogsmeade.

ALBUS: I hate Hogsmeade.

HARRY: How can you hate a place you haven't actually visited yet?

ALBUS: Because I know it'll be full of Hogwarts students.

ALBUS screws up the paper. (Rowling 16).

The data shows Albus has become a third year student and it is time when Hogwarts students can go to Hogsmeade. Hogsmeade is a small paradise for third year students to shop, date, or even just stretch the leg muscles while packing some various candies. Hogsmeade is located very close to Hogwarts, exactly in the northwest of Hogwarts. To be able to visit that place, the student must register with a form. Harry gives the form to Albus so he can go there and make fun with it, but Albus hate that place even though he has never visited it yet. The reason why he hates that place is just because there will be many of Hogwarts pupils. It means that he does not deign with anything which is related to Hogwarts.

In another scene, Albus has an initiate that he gets away and stops to school with Scorpius. It is showed below;

but Delphi is a fake friend. Albus is too easy to trust Delphi, he never thinks of her bad character and her intentions in stealing Time-Turner for her own will. So he is betrayed by someone he considers as a friend.

3.2. The Influence of Albus' Experience to His Character

Since Albus has always been compared to his father in the story, it is necessary to compare the experience of Harry Potter with the experience of Albus to reveal its influence. Same as Albus' experience which is sorted based on his experiences as a child, as a student and as well as a friend. The comparison of the Harry Potter's experience will also be adjusted based on those three criteria.

3.2.1. The Influence as Harry Potter's Son

First, the experience of Harry Potter as a child is certainly very different from Albus' experience because since childhood Harry has experienced a bad situation in his life. His parents died when he was a baby so he was only raised by his uncle's family. He also has a bad relationship with his uncle's family. Although they still have a blood relationship with Harry Potter, but the Dursley family enter into a group of antagonist characters. For the information, Harry Potter's mother, Lily, is Petunia's sister, Vernon Dursley's wife. The Dursleys hates Lily for being jealous of the magical talents of their siblings while from their families had absolutely no talent as a wizard. The proof is on the data below;

ALBUS: For you, it's the greatest place on earth. I know. The poor orphan, bullied by his uncle and aunt Dursley...

HARRY: Albus, please—can we just—

ALBUS: ...traumatized by his cousin, Dudley, saved by Hogwarts. I know it all, Dad. Blah, blah, blah. (Rowling 25)

Albus says "traumatized by his cousin, Dudley" where Dudley is the son of the Dursleys. Harry is traumatized by Dursley's mischievous behavior towards Harry, while his parents simply silence for his cruel child's deeds, instead they are joining to bully him by leveraging their family's internal problems. Albus has also said "saved by Hogwarts" which means that Harry's life can be more meaningful when he is at Hogwarts. It is very clear because in his family, Harry is very wasted as a child. He is not treated like a child who needs love and affection. It is very different from Albus as a child who has a whole family, father and mother are still complete and also brothers and sister who he has. Even in the previous explanation, Albus set off with his entire family when he first entered Hogwarts School. It proves that his family is very indulgent and loves Albus, but because the treatment of his family who is too pampering can affect the character of Albus who becomes acts whatever he likes, as has been described in the previous discussion.

Harry is very fond of Albus as his son, but he never thinks that his treatment to his child makes a negative impact and influence on his own son's behavior. When Albus makes trouble at his school, Harry is also reprimanded and given advice by Mr.

field at his school. On the first day getting the material about a flying broomstick, Albus simply cannot move the broom into his hand. Also when the lesson of building a potion wherein he incorrectly incorporates the ingredients and makes the herb explodes so he has to repeat again from the beginning of the process of making the correct potion. Certainly it is very different from Harry where in his past he was very smart and brave to successfully defeat Voldemort. In Harry's dreams of his past, he has been called as a very outstanding wizard in the world. Even in this story Harry has managed to become an important person in Hogwarts School as part of the ministry of magic.

HAGRID: Harry—yer a wizard—yeh changed everything. Yer the most famous wizard in the whole world. (Rowling 29).

On the other hand, because Harry is so great at school that Albus cannot accept the fact that he is Harry's child. It happens because of the difference in Hogwarts' way of looking at them that the son of Harry will always be as great as his father. The bitter reality that Albus does not inherit his father's greatness frustrated him in the face of the Hogwarts who always compared between him and his father. The expression of his frustration can be seen in Albus words below;

ALBUS: The poor orphan who went on to save us all. So may I say—on behalf of wizarding kind—how grateful we are for your heroism. Should we bow now or will a curtsy do? (Rowling 26)

Hermione says that people are paying attention to them, meaning the three of them are Harry, Ron, and Hermione. It makes her feel uncomfortable so she wants to hurry away. Then Ginny responds by saying that people are always paying attention when the three of them are gathering, and when separated the people pay attention to Harry. This very clearly proves that the three of them spend much time together from childhood so that the Hogwarts people has already recognized them, especially since Harry has managed to save Hogwarts from Voldemort's threat, people were paying more attention to Harry.

When the meeting takes place in the Ministry of Magic, Harry is arguing with Draco, because Draco does not believe about the matter Voldemort will come back because Harry feels a premonition of Voldemort's chance of getting back through the wound on his forehead, Draco considers the matter is unnecessarily exaggerated because Voldemort is absolutely dead. He also prejudices against Harry by saying that Harry just wants his fame back. However, Ron and Hermione incline to defend Harry. This case can be seen from the fragment of the following dialog;

DRACO: You know what this is about? Harry just wants his face back in the newspapers again. We've had rumors of Voldemort coming back from the Daily Prophet once a year every year—

HARRY: None of those rumors came from me!

DRACO: Really? Doesn't your wife edit the Daily Prophet?

GINNY steps towards him, outraged.

from his trapped son in the past with the location where they are trapped. It can make easier for them to look for it and also against Delphi who has been very outrageous.

At the end of the story, Albus finally realizes that he has been wrong in doing something. He learns from the experiences and problems he faces which make him wiser and mature in solving his problems. Albus also has made up with his father and he has been open-minded even though he is different from his father but he is still trying to be a good boy. It can be known from the following data;

HARRY: I know. But the thing that scares me most, Albus Severus Potter, is being a dad to you. Because I'm operating without wires here. Most people at least have a dad to base themselves on—and either try to be or try not to be. I've got nothing—or very little. So I'm learning, okay? And I'm going to try with everything I've got—to be a good dad for you.

ALBUS: And I'll try and be a better son. I know I'm not James, Dad, I'll never be like you two— (Rowling 213).

The data above clearly informs that Albus finally accepts himself as a Harry Potter's son and he wants to try to correct his mistake for being rude and disobey to his parents, especially to his father. He also does not care that he cannot be like his brother James, who is cleverer and more diligent than him, he just want to be himself and make his dad proud for being himself. Therefore, Harry also learns a lot from those phenomena that he wants to try to be a better father for his children.
