



report of the classroom research gave teachers' insight into what happen in the classroom, so that they can compare the interaction that happen in that class with their own classrooms. The processes were the main concern of the research as she has done an observation in the classroom, recorded the classroom talk, analyzed the data and described the meaning of the data in detail. Concerning the processes, researcher describe further that processes here refer to the process of interaction involving both the classroom and the students in the classroom.

The researcher observed how the participant of the classroom activities were aware of when and where they have to take turn, how is interaction between student and student in presentation class of speaking III. However, in this class the teacher is only monitoring the students activities without involving in those.

Meanwhile, in collecting the data certain techniques are needed. In relation to this Sunarto propose five techniques namely,<sup>2</sup> 1) participant observation, 2) in-depth interview, 3) taking notes/information, 4) focused group, and 5) documentation. In this study non participant observation technique is used because the researcher, as a key instrument, did not involve in the classroom. Beside observation, she was also took notes. This technique is used to collect data which may not be obtained by means of recording and to describe and interpret the data their selves.

## **B. Subject of the Study**

The subjects of this study is the fourth semester students in academic year 2011/2012 of the S1 program of English Department at University of Muhammadiyah

and the students will participate in the classroom naturally. Therefore, according to Walsh as quoted in Dewi Pratiningsih states that the use of audio recording is suitable to reduce level of intrusiveness although it will not capture visual evidence that may contribute to the naturalness of the data.<sup>6</sup>

The data of this study were collected through a non participant observation in the classroom for four meeting on 08<sup>th</sup>, 15<sup>th</sup>, 22<sup>th</sup> of June in 2012 and the last is on 9<sup>th</sup> of July 2012. In acquiring the data, the following steps were taken, the first step was records the utterance for four meeting. The recording is done for each meeting depending on the subject matter.

The researcher only recorded classroom talks and did not involve in the classroom activities. While observing the class, she was also taking notes for certain things which cannot be record but were necessary to obtain sufficient data.

The next procedure was transcribed the recorded talks. After transcribing the recorded talks, they were segmented into exchanges; this term was used based on the review of literature. And then identify the moves and acts that occur in interaction class.

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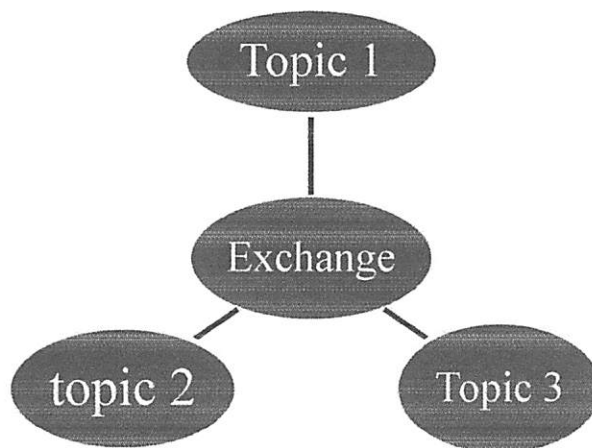
