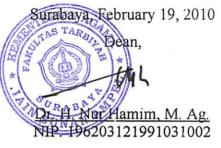
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#### **ABSTRACT**

Diary writing is the technique that enables student to encourage a writing habit, and to develop fluency as well as to improve student's motivation and attitude towards writing. Diary writing is also called as journal writing. Journal writing is another innovation in writing classrooms has probably been the most widely used and successful activity during the last decade. It has grown from an adjunct activity to a fully integrated part of the writing class. Journal is note book that someone keeps to record daily thoughts.

As a teenager most of the students' usually wrote their feelings, activities, thinking, and ideas on the diary writing. However, some of them still wrote it in Indonesia. It could be better for them to write diary in English. Diary writing could be used as an English teaching media to improve the students' writing skill.

The ways of teaching writing are usually monotonous and still in traditional way. According Djago, the teacher is not able to give the techniques that make the student's interest in writing. Writing skill carried out at school still have the weakness. One of the weaknesses is the way of teaching because the teacher usually has no variation, cannot stimulate the students and has less frequency of writing. The teacher usually ask the students to make paragraph when they are not interested the topics and also lets them doing their task even they cannot start or finish their writing.

The research design used in this study was experimental research. The data of the study was the students' diary writing of SMA Al- Azhar class X Billngual, Menganti Gresik. The writer collected and analyzed the students' writing work. Then, she identified their ability in term of content, organization, vocabulary, language and mechanic. She analyzed and gave the score by using ESL composition profile this.

This research is focus on improving student's writing skill as well as such other outcomes. The researcher find that the students' how their writing will be evaluated motivation to write diary writing in English teaching learning process. It can be seen from post test pre-test score that has been analyzed by using sample paired t-test, it gets  $t_{hitung} = 3,143$  and t tabel= 2, 04 with significance level 5% or 0.05. it means that  $t_{hitung} > t_{label}$ . It means null hypothesis is offered and there s no sgnfcance nfluence s rejected.

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### CHAPTER I

#### INTRODUCTION

### A. Background of study

English is very important. English is one of the languages, which is used internationally. More than a half people in the world using English communication, getting knowledge, information, science and technology, etc. Many popular books on science, business, computer and many other on written in English, that is way English is taking an important role in our life now days. The most important aim of learning English is to master both spoken and written form in order to use it for communication.

According to the reason above, mastering English is one of the important things to answer the challenge of the globalization Era. One of the ways to mastery English at school. In Indonesia, English is taught from the kindergarten up to the university level. one of the aim of teaching and learning English for the Senior High School is to develop the listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills for the student. The competency based Curriculum (CBC) for the Senior High School states that: <sup>1</sup>

"The aim of English lesson is develop skill of communication in English into oral and written form. Communication skill consist of listening, speaking, reading, and writing"

As a compulsory subject, English should be mastered well by the students. In the teaching and learning process the students are expected to be able to listen, speak, read, and write in English to make them competent. It means that the end of teaching and learning process of the senior high school, the students, are expected to master both oral and written expression. And also, based on the CBC curriculum of the senior high school, the four skills a must be taught integrated.<sup>2</sup> It is clear that the four skills listening, speaking, reading, and writing cannot be separated each other. Actually, the main emphasis of the teaching and learning process is on the grammatical structures. It means that the students are expected to be able to use English as well in their daily life.

However must of the students still have difficulty in understanding English, Even they have got the English lesson in the previous level (Elementary school and Junior High School). It is too difficult for them to communicate in oral or written form by using English. It can be many factors. One of the factors is in teaching – learning process especially for writing. In learning process in the classroom, the previous problem is the actual causes of student's difficulties in the Senior High School to develop a topic, where they are often influenced by fear to make mistake in grammar, limitation of vocabulary not be able to develop a coherent composition, etc. besides the teacher himself who is not able to give various techniques in teaching writing skill.

Writing skill carried out at school still have the weakness.<sup>3</sup> One of the weaknesses is the way of teaching because the teacher usually has no variation, cannot stimulate the students and has less frequency of writing. The teacher usually ask the students to make paragraph when they are not interested the topics and also lets them doing their task even they cannot start or finish their writing.

According to the writer, students are not interested in the topics and also let them doing their task even they cannot starting or finishing their writing. Here teacher are challenged to be more creative to make learning process more fun and motivated.

One of other techniques that enables student to encourage a writing habit and to develop fluency as well as to improve student's motivation and attitude toward writing is diary writing.

Diary writing is also called as journal writing. Journal writing is another innovation in writing classrooms has probably been the most widely used and successful activity during the last decade. It has grown from an adjunct activity to a fully integrated part of the writing class. Journal is note book that someone

keeps to record daily thoughts. Usually it contents of one's personal writing of feelings, activities and experiences that he/ she writes everyday.<sup>4</sup>

Ken Autrey suggests, journals are a valid genre in themselves and should not be marginalized as simply diaries.<sup>5</sup> Journal can be used as opportunities for students teacher dialogs; as places to record notes, gather materials, and plan writing; and for write to learn activities that stress metacognition (that is, writing to discover what the student has learned, and reflecting on the processes of learning to learn). Moreover, a journal is that they engage students in non threatening exploration and development of ideas: they are" the most consistently effective tool for establishing fluency".<sup>6</sup>

Journal are typically of two types: 'personal journal in which learners write diary like accounts of day to day experience and thoughts and 'intellectual journal', in which students reflect on readings, lectures, class discussion, their own ideas, or their ongoing writing process. In this technique the teacher will give theme to the students' writing, the theme is "unforgettable experience" so, the students can practice (do their work) and develop the topic and also composition of their writing without, ignore the grammatical errors for a while mainly to build the students courageous of writing with thirty to forty five minutes based on material individually.

# C. Objective Of The Study

Based on the statement of the study, the objective of the study is:

- 1. To know improvement of the students' diary writing.
- 2. To describe the effectiveness of diary writing and students' writing skill at SMA Al- Azhar Menganti Gresik

# D. Significance Of The Study

This study is expected to give information about diary writing that can be used in writing activities. Besides, the outcomes will contribute the improvement and variation in teaching learning process. Moreover, will develop the students'

creativity, make them to be more courage and expressive to their ideas and to get the way in learning English especially in learning writing.

## E. Scope and Limitation

Due to the limited time, the study is only limited to the second years students of the senior high school with the assumption that they need more exercises and expected to be able to make a paragraph in narrative.<sup>8</sup> and also to develop their writing ability. Whereas, the scope of the study is teaching English as foreign language, especially teaching writing using diary writing.

## F. Definition of Key Terms.

To make this study more understanding, this study the following definitions are as follow:

### a. Writing

Writing is one of the four language skills that are taught in senior high school.

According to Byrne, Writing is a production of graphic symbols that have to be arranged according to certain convention to from words have to be arranged to from the sentence.

#### **CHAPTER II**

## REVIEW OF RELATED LITERATURE

### A. The Nature of Writing

Writing is one way of making meaning from experience for us and for others. Writing is a place to express feeling, experiences, ideas and thoughts. Writing in English is to express ideas, feelings opinions and others in Indonesia and the ability to express something in writing from in English. Nunan writes that:

"Writing is the mental work of inventing ideas, thinking about how to express them, and organizing them into statements and paragraphs that will be clear to reader."<sup>2</sup>

Besides, Langan mentioned that expressing thought in writing is a complex subject, which involves organization of thought, sound usage of the English language, and imagination.<sup>3</sup> Moreover, Young and Savage show that writing skill cannot come automatically.<sup>4</sup> It requires some experiences, talents and a lot of regular training. It can be inferred that writing is difficult and complex subject; it needs a lot of practice and talent.

For those reasons, most of the people are afraid to write. It is because they doubt to make mistake. Writing is a skill that is acquired through study, never felt

afraid to write because of worried to make errors.<sup>5</sup> Making mistakes in writing is a stage that everyone passes through. Writing down the ideas will help the one to start writing.

Writing is different from other skills, such as listening, speaking and reading. We can clarify our messages by using intonations, expressions and gestures, but in writing the writer should express the writer's feelings, thoughts and opinions on words clearly to the readers. The writer has to create it own context in the absence of the readers. The write is only helped by mechanics and words choice to express his/her feelings, thoughts and opinions to the readers.

## B. Types of Writing

#### a. Narration

Narration is the form of writing used to describe to the reader about even that happen clearly. Narration places occurrences in time and tells what happened according to natural time sequence. Types of narration include short stories, novels, and new stories, as well as a large part of our everyday social interchange in form of letters and conversation. 8

Narrative is a familiar type of communication. Narration is an effective and useful in all kinds of writing. It involves short stories, novels and news. Good narration has four essential features. They are a clear context (telling when, where, and to whom the action happened), well - chosen details (including enough details that can make the readers know what is happening but not so much, it can make them over - whelmed, confused and bored), logically often chronogically organization (beginning with the scene, paints the picture in the middle and ending with making the points), and an appropriate and consistent point of view (the first or the third point of view).

## b. Description

To describe is to create a verbal picture. A person, a place, a thingeven an idea or state of mind - can be made vividly concrete through description. 10 They also state that good description includes enough vivid detail to create the dominant impression (the single quality, mood, or atmosphere that the writer wishes to emphasize) and to bring a scene of life. However, the writer usually uses the description to create the setting for a story, to illustrate ideas, to help clarify a definition of comparison, or to make the complexities of a process more understandable. Therefore, the description

should be kept short, and include enough detail to make the reader easily to understand.<sup>11</sup>

### c. Exposition

The purpose of exposition is to clarify, explain and inform. <sup>12</sup> They also state that it can be in the form of *process analysis* (answering the question how and explain how something works or gives step – by – step direction for doing something), *definition* (statement the meaning of a word or a term), *illustration* (use the examples to explain, elucidate or corroborate to make the ideas clear and concrete), *classification* (grouping separate things or ideas into categories), *comparison and contrast* (points out the similarities and differences between two or more subjects in the same class or category to clarify – to reach some conclusion about the items being compared and contrasted), and *cause and effect* (explain the reason for an occurrence or the consequences of an action). <sup>13</sup>

## d. Argumentation

Argumentation is the rhetoric form that is intended to persuade people's attitude and opinion in order that they trust and action suitable with

what the writer want. 14 an attempt to persuade the readers to accept points of view of the writer, to make decision, or to purpose a particular course of an action. There are two basic types of argumentation appeals to the rational or intellectual of the readers to convince him the truth of a particular statements or belief. Persuasive argumentation appeals the emotions and opinions of the readers moving to the action. 15

## C. The Teaching of Writing

One way to learn foreign language is through writing. Writing as one of the language skills should be mastered by the students who are learning a language. Since writing is often difficult to be learned by the students, the teacher has to be able to guide and create an interest way to teach writing. Writing skill is complex and sometimes difficult to teach, requiring mastery not only of grammatical and rhetorical devices, but also it has conceptual and judgment elements.16 More over, he says that judgment skill is the ability to write in an appropriate manner for a particular purpose with particular audience in mind. together with an ability to select, organize and order relevant information. 17

Actually there are some principles for teaching writing which have to be considered by teachers. According Nunan proposes that there are 4 principles for teaching writing:<sup>18</sup>

# 1. Understand your students' reason for writing.

If the teacher's goals do not match the students', there will be greatest dissatisfaction with writing instruction. It means it is important to understand and convey the goals to students.

# 2. Provide many opportunities for student to write.

Writing needs a lot of practices, so, teachers must evaluate their lesson plans in order to make the writing classes scheduled and will be like as it expected.

# 3. Make feedback helpful and meaningful.

Giving feedback to the students writing is very meaningful. The students crave feedback on their writing. Make sure that comments on students papers understandable for them.

 Clarify for your self and for your students, how their writing will be evaluated.

In this case, rubric can be used as a way to avoid subjectivity in evaluating the students' writing.

However, teachers should consider the principles in teaching writing so that it will create a good atmosphere in writing classes. When teaching writing, the teacher should lead their students through several stages over a long period of time – the length is depending, as usual, on their age, interest, capacities, needs to freer stages where they are able to write a composition or essay on a topic of interest. <sup>19</sup>

Moreover, when teaching writing, teacher should take into account special considerations including the organizing of sentences into paragraphs, how paragraphs are joined together, and the general organization of ideas into a coherent piece of discourse.<sup>20</sup> Beside that, teachers can give different types of classroom writing performance to vary the writing class activity. The teacher should make an effort and be creative to help the students in learning writing effectively. There is a way to help the learners find out what they want to write about and to overcome imaginative blocks; it is generative activities.<sup>21</sup> As a guide, the teacher should guide them based on their age, interest, capacities and needs since not all of them have the right mood at that time such as giving them diary writing in the process of writing.

There are three major types of classroom performance according Douglas Brown:<sup>22</sup>

## 1. Imitative or writing down

It is a type of classroom writing done at the beginning level it can be in form of dictation.

#### 2. Intensive or controlled

Intensive writing sometimes is used as a production mode for learning, reinforcing or testing grammatical concept. In intensive writing typically appears in controlled writing that presents a paragraph to students in which they have to alter a given structure throughout.

### 3. Self writing

It is writing with the self in mind as an audience. It can be in a form of diary or journal writing.

### D. Diary Writing

Diary writing is also called as a journal. It is not an academic exercise a business report or a formal letter. It is such a personal composition. Journal are typically of two types: 'personal journal' in which learners write diary like accounts of day to day experience and thoughts and 'intellectual journal', in

Journal is a note book that someone keeps to record daily thoughts.

Usually it contents of one's personal writing of feelings, activities and experiences that he/she write everyday.<sup>24</sup>

Ken Autrey suggests that Journal are valid genre in them selves and should not be marginalized as simply diaries.<sup>25</sup> a Journal can be used as opportunities for students teacher dialogs; as places to record notes, gather materials, and plan writing; and for write to learn activities that stress metacognition (that is, writing to discover what the student has learned, and reflecting on the processes of learning to learn).<sup>26</sup>

Writing journal or diary is simple but effective way to develop enhances great understanding about the writer self.<sup>27</sup> It is meaning that understanding about how the writer becomes what the writer (she or he) is. What direction in she or he want to go a head in her life. Kirby sates that journal or diary writing is that they engage students in non threatening exploration and development of ideas: they are" the most consistently effective tool for establishing fluency".<sup>28</sup>

Writing in a journal can help to examine and reflecting the ideas. The journal is an important source for story and essay ideas.<sup>29</sup> It can be inferred that journal will be a place to explain, record, and observe the ideas and also will become a source of writing ideas for now and on the future.

There are some characteristics of the journal A journal is *intimate*, *private* (although it is private, it is also could be read by other people), can catch the photograph meanings (in the words and give some information, which cannot give by the picture), can make the stories in the past are live. The journal languages are natural, clear and expressive that can make diary or journal is more interesting to read.<sup>30</sup>

There are few simple rules to get the best result on the diary writing they are:<sup>31</sup>

a. Write diary everyday at a regular.

Specified time and do not to do all the writing for a week in one or two days.

b. Find the best time and place to write.

It should be relaxed and alert time, and a place that make the work uninterrupted for 30-45 minutes.

   Topics that can make enjoy in thinking and learning; topics that can be share with others
- d. Do not worry about spellings and grammar, just write it
  It means that do not worry to make a mistake in spelling and grammar) it can help to start writing a diary freely

However, for the writer, journalist, novelist, and others, diary or journal is very important. They can write a book from their experiences that are written in the diary. For example Mochtar Lubis, the famous writer and journalist, he wrote his feelings, thinking, and ideas on his diary during he were in the prison struggling in the justice in the county. In 1981, he wrote his diary and published it.<sup>32</sup>

### 4. The Example of diary writing

Here is an entry from a journal written by an advance ESL student from China. The teacher's response follows (from Vanett and Jurich, 1985) Journal entry:<sup>36</sup>

## Journal entry:

Yesterday at about eight o'clock I was sitting in front of my table holding a fork and eating tasteless noodles which I usually really like to eat but I lost my taste yesterday because I didn't feel well. I had a headache and a fever. My head seemed to be broken. I sometimes felt cold, sometimes hot. I didn't feel comfortable standing up and I didn't feel comfortable sitting down. I hated everything around me. It seemed to me that I got a great pressure from the atmosphere and I could not breath. I was so sleepy since I had taken some medicine which functioned as an antibiotic.

The room was so quiet. I was there by myself and felt very solitary. This dinner reminded me of my mother. Whenever I was sick in china, my mother always took care of me and cooked rice gruel, which has to cook more than there hours and is very delicious, I think. I would be better very soon under the care of my mother. But yesterday, I had to cook by myself even though I was sick, the more I thought, the less I wanted to eat, half anhour passed. The noodles were cold, but I was still sitting there and thinking about my mother, finally I threw out the noodles and went to bed.

You used vivid details, like "...eating tasteless noodles..." my head seemed to be broken..." and rice gruel, which has to cook more than three hours and is very delicious. "These make it easy for the reader to picture exactly what you were going through. The other strong point about this piece is that you bring the reader full circle by beginning and ending with "the noodles."

Being alone when you are a sick is difficult. Now, I know why you were so quite n class.

If you want to do another entry related to this one, you could have a dialogue with your "sick" self. What would your "healthy" self say to the

## E. Writing Assessment

To evaluate the students' writing ability, the teacher uses the assessment. Assessment is important in the process of evaluation of the efficiency and affectivities of teaching and learning. Assessment is concerned with the quality of teaching as well as the quality of learning.<sup>37</sup>

Assessment includes some meanings of checking what students can do with the language. Assessment may be carried out before, during or after a course, or it may not even be connected with a course.<sup>38</sup> More over, he says that assessment includes a whole range of activities from the informal short test on last night's homework to the formal external examination. It is also includes regular worked course, work assignments forming part of a course, as well as periodic testing.<sup>39</sup>

In addition, he also states that there is no universally good way of assessing. What and how assess should obviously depends on the purpose. The purposes of the assessment are *placement* (to place a student on a suitable course), diagnosis (to specify the students' particular strength and weakness), *selection* (to

In this study, the teacher used progress assessment to know the progress of the students in writing skill. The teacher used diary writing to assess them. The progress of the students in writing ability can be known from the result of the analysis and the scores of the students' composition.

### F. Review of Previous Study

She design used in her study was descriptive study. She conducted a study about the implementation of diary writing. This study was conducted, in order to know how the content, language use and mechanics used by the students when using diary writing.

There is similarity between this study and the previous study. Both of them try to apply diary writing technique in learning and teaching process. They are also expected to give a good suggestion in applying diary writing technique in teaching and learning process.

The researcher design of this study uses an experimental research; there are experimental class and control class. On the other hand, the previous of the study used descriptive to describe the students' writing in order to know five component they are, content, organization, vocabulary, language use and mechanics when using diary writing. Here, the writer would like to describe the effectiveness of using diary writing to improve students' writing skill by doing such an experimental research.

### CHAPTER III

### RESEARCH METHODOLOGY

This chapter describes the steps of the research. It describes the research design, research setting and subject, population and sample, research variable, research instrument, method of data collection and data analysis.

## A. Research design

This study uses qualitative – quantitative research method. Qualitative research method is used for describing improvement of the students' writing content, organization, vocabulary, language use and mechanic during the application of using diary writing and students' writing skill after the application of using diary writing technique. Quantitative research method is used for analyzing the statistic data that is students' pre – test and post - test score. By that score, the researcher can analyze how the effectiveness of using diary writing on students' writing skill is. This study purposes to get information that deals with experiment. Research design in this study is called A Pre Experimental Design: the one group pre - test and post – test. There is one class that be taken the data. It is given a treatment of application of using diary writing.

### F. Technique of data collection

In collecting the data during research, the researcher used data students' writing assessment. The data will collect and analyzed to know their improvement in their writing ability in term of their content, organization, vocabulary, language use and mechanics when they taught by using diary writing. In this assessment of diary writing the students' will asked to write a composition and develop the composition without: ignore the grammatical errors for a while mainly to build the students courageous of writing. The researcher scored the students' writings by using adaptation and simplified ESL composition profile.

The progress of the students in writing ability can be known from the result of the analysis and the scores of the students' composition.

In order to know the effectiveness of using diary writing on students' writing skill, students in experimental class are given a test before and after diary writing technique being applied. Here, the researcher uses paired sample t-test. Paired sample t-test analyzes post-test and pre-test score. However, before using paired sample t-test, it will be done normality test as the requirement.

#### **CHAPTER IV**

# **RESULT AND DISCUSSION**

This research was diary writing research. It focuses writing skill to improve diary writing in the english teaching learning process in class X bilingual at SMA Al-Azhar menganti Gresik academic years 2009-2010. This research followed principles of writing. Some principles were taken in teaching Methodology by Nunan David state as follows: (1)Understand your students' reason for writing. If the teacher's goals do not match the students', there will be greatest dissatisfaction with writing instruction. It means it is important to understand and convey the goals to students. (2) Provide many opportunities for student to write. Writing needs a lot of practices, so teachers must evaluate their lesson plans in order to make the writing classes scheduled and will be like as it expected. (3)Make feedback helpful and meaningful. Giving feedback to the students writing is very meaningful. The students crave feedback on their writing. Make sure that comments on students papers understandable for them. (4) Clarify for your self and for your students, how their writing will be evaluated. In this case, rubric can be used as a way to avoid subjectivity in evaluating the students' writing.

#### A. Result

# 1. Student writing skill after the implementation of diary writing

In this research, the researcher as an English teacher was helped by class English teacher. We collaborate in observasing class and determine some action to implementation the methodology of diary writing.

The school setting of SMA Al- Azhar Gresik is islamic Senior High School. The school is located at jalan Raya Menganti Krajan Nomor 474 Gresik East Java. The total number of student is 233 student and the total of teacher is 39. It is class consist of 40 - 50 students of the average. While the teaching learning process is carried from 06.45 A.M until 02.00 P.M.

This school has four hours per week, for English as an extraculiculer has two hours. One English teacher can teach six classes. The teacher use the communicative approach while English for fun is the book used in English class.

Class setting the total number of students in class X (class bilingual) was 31 students consisting of eleven male, and twenty femile students and the Eglish teaching learning activity English class is carried out twice a week and duration of fourty five minutes two per class hour.

The experiment are conducted on 3 November (Pre-test) and 4 November (Post-test). The researcher was teacher who implementate the experiment and the class teacher as observer during English teaching learning process.

The implementation of Pre-test, the researcher gave explanation of diary writing method at glance than she gave a paper and the student's wrote

## **B.** Discussion

Diary writing is a note book that someone keeps to record daily thoughts. Usually it contents of one's personal writing of feelings, activities and experiences that he/she write everyday. Researcher find that the students encourage to have motivation to write diary writing in English teaching learning process they are more happy on their learning. The use of diary eriting can make the student more interested in english and in the teaching learning process can make it easier for the student to learn subject method.

The use of diary writing in the teaching learning process can also make the students more simpathhetic and make the student more exploited to express their ideas. On the basis of the result of the action, it can be know that the use of diary writing in the English teaching learning is consider successful in improving the students writing in the English teaching learning process. It is very good in rising the students motivation and interest in English. However according to researcher it is quite difficult for change verb-1 to verb-2 for the students.

The result shows that diary writing can help the students encourage to learn and understand the subject method more easly after conducting diary writing most of the student have better vocabulary and gramatical in writing. In diary writing, the students they can learn about diction, enrichement, organization, content, vocabulary, language use, and mechanic. Competition for the best diary writing is regarded as a way the best in their learning it can

also make the students keep having spirit to learn and to be active. They want to be better than others and they want accept succes in their learning.

From post-test score data that have been analyzed by using t-test (sample paired t-test), it is proved there is a significance difference between result of students writing before and after the application of diary writing. Based on the result of post-test score that has been analyzed by using sample paired that has been analyzed by using sample paired t-test, it gets  $t_{hitung} = 3.6779$  and  $t_{tabel} = 2.0452$  with significance level 5% or 0,05. Because  $t_{hitung} > t_{tabel}$ . So,  $H_0$  rejected. It is means that students' writing skill before and after treatment is not same. In other word, using diary writing method is effective to improve students writing skill in SMA Al- Azhar Menganti Gresik..

#### **CHAPTER V**

### **CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION**

## A. Conclusion

The diary writing in the English teaching learning process in class X-Bilingual SMA Al-Azhar Menganti gresik in the academic years 2009/2010. the researcher and English teacher have done some collaborative work through some step: observation, planing, implementation the action, threatment and analyzed the conclution concerning of diary writing research result as follows:

- 1. Based on the result of students pre-test it can be known that the result of students' writing before the implementation of diary writing method is less than after the implementation of diary writing method. In indicates that there is an influence of the implementation of diary writing on students writing skill.
- 2. Based on the result of post-test score that has been analyzed by using sample paired t-test, it gets  $t_{hitung} = 3.6779$  and  $t_{tabel} = 2.0452$  with significance level 5% or 0.05. it means that  $t_{hitung} > t_{tabel}$ . So, null hypothesis that is offered that there is no significance influence is rejected. It is means that students' writing skill before and after treatment is not same. In other word, using diary writing method is effective to improve students writing skill in SMA Al- Azhar Menganti Gresik..

# B. Suggestion

Based on the result of the research, it seems need to order some suggestion for education development, especially English. Here are the suggestion:

- 1. Teacher need to used diary writing as method that can attrack the student in their learning so that thay can keep the writing in the process than. This research suggest that teacher use diary writing can attrack the student interest in learning to improve teaching learning for quality of writing.
- 2. Student's need to increase their discipline for writing, for example; enrich vocabulary, content, language use, organization, mechanic, gramatical error, diction etc. in order they can use diary writing in real life for writing their own experience without any making mistakes.
- 3. The new method make joyful situation of learning so, research suggest that the teacher impplement something different in teaching learning process like competition and giving small prizes to the best student especially in diary writing. Those thing are very supportive to make student's more interest in English especially in writing.

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
