CHAPTER 1

INTRODUCTION

This chapter contains the background of study, where the thesis writer explains the reason why she chooses the drama. In addition, the thesis writer asserts her personal reason for choosing this study of the character's psychological problem as the topic of the thesis.

Furthermore, the thesis writer states the statement of the problem, the objective of the study, scope and limitation of the study, significance of the study, and the last method of the study.

1.1. Background of the Study

In literary works, there are ways to express ideas. They can be poems, songs, novel and drama. There have been various attempts to define literature. You can define it, for example, as 'imaginative' writing in the sense of fiction- writing which is not literally true (Eagleton, 1). Literature is an imagination or creation of an author to write the literary work. Literature can be developed and interpret language based on our interpretations. Literature also gives the readers pleasure and knowledge, and can emphasize our interpretation. In the literary work, we can find some genres. One of the literary genres is Drama.

Drama is a composition in prose form that presents a story entirely told in dialogue and action and written with the intention of its eventual performance before

the audiences (Dinurriyah, 5). Drama is not written in paragraphs like novel or short story, it is written as lines of dialogue in a script. It can be said that a drama is a piece of writing that is presented through dialogue and action. Like a short story or novel, drama has some elements, which are setting, plot, and characters. The characters in drama can generally be divided into major characters and minor characters. A good indicator as to weather a character major and minor is the amount of time and speech as well as presence onstage he or she is allocated (Dinurriyah, 114). Major characters usually have a lot to say and appear frequently throughout the drama, while minor characters have less presence only marginally. The plot structure of the drama does not differ from that in prose. There is an exposition, a rising action, a climax, falling action, and the last is the resolution.

One of American drama which is interesting is *Cat on a Hot Tin Roof*by Tennessee Williams. It is one of William's best-known works and his personal
favorite. The drama set is in the plantation home in the Mississippi Delta. The owner
of the plantation is Big Daddy Pollitt. He is a wealthy cotton tycoon. The play
examines the relationships among members of Big Daddy's family, primarily between
his son Brick and Maggie, Brick's wife. This drama presents about a girl, named
Maggie who's married with Brick who is an alcoholic and has a psychological
problem since his best friend Skipper died. Brick in this drama has some problem;
one of the problems is the fact that Brick do not have children. It makes Brick's

parents and brothers questioned about their relationship in bed. The second problem in the drama is Brick being alcoholic.

The writer is interested in this drama because it tells about some aspects that occur in human life, for example, alcoholics. According MNT article, an alcoholic is a man or woman who suffers from alcoholism. An alcoholic is a person, while alcoholism is the illness (MNT article). It often occurs in human life. This study focuses on the psychological problem one of the character in this drama, Brick. The writer wants to know the causes of Brick being an alcoholic in this drama.

1.2. Statement of Problem

After reading the drama and determining the topic, there are questions that could be raised. The questions are as the following:

The writer hopes this study could be one of the references to study of American drama, especially about psychological problem that often occur in the human life.

1.5. Scope and Limitation of the Study

This study will only focus on the character, Brick, as an alcoholic man in *Cat* on a *Hot Tin Roof* which is written by Tennessee Williams. In order to make the discussion more specific, this study will continue to describe the causes of one of psychological problem that occur in one of the characters in this drama.

1.6. Method of the Study

A. Research Design
