

One of ambiguous cases in communication is speech. The speaker gives information without responses from the hearers. The hearers do not understand meaning of words or sentences which is intended by speakers. For example in speech of Barack Obama in Cairo: *“Their actions are irreconcilable with the rights of human beings, the progress of nations, and with Islam”*. The first perception is there are three measures for irreconcilable, these are the rights of human beings, the progress of nations and Islam. The second perception is there are two measures, these are the rights of human beings and progress in nations and Islam.

The data of this research are taken from speech of Barack Obama in Cairo University June 4th 2009. It uses Robert's theory about ambiguity based on analogy.

This research is expected to identify the kinds of ambiguity and interpretation found in the speech of Barack Obama when he gave speech in Cairo University, the first speech in front of public about peace world. Furthermore, this research discusses the interpretations which may arise in the ambiguous words and sentences found in speech of Barack Obama. This research entitled **“Ambiguity Analysis and Interpretation of Barack Obama’s Speech in Cairo”**.
