CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

5.1 CONCLUSION

This last chapter presents the conclusion which is drawn from the result of the analysis data. It is presented to answer the problem statements of the research. The conclusions of this research can be seen as follows:

- 5.1.1 There are several paradigm cases of representative illocutionary act which appear in 10 fairy tales. Those are *asserting*, *explaining*, *believing*, *convincing*, *suggesting*, *describing*, *affirming*, *swearing*, *and telling*. Representative of asserting and believing become the speech which is the most dominant used in this study.
- 5.1.2 The most dominant reason for performing certain representative are to show the *speaker's* care toward the hearer and to convey information in order to make the hearer understand.

5.2 SUGGESTIONS

Based on this research, the researcher has some recommendations to the next researcher as follows:

- 5.2.1 It is expected to the other researchers to examine certain types of representative such as affirming or swearing to find out the different possibilities of findings which can create better understanding of representative illocutionary acts.
- 5.2.2 Based on the findings, the reason why the characters employ such kind of representative are to show the speaker's care toward the hearer and to convey information in order to make the hearer understand. Then, it is recommended to the other researcher also to find the characterization of the character. Whether any relation between the reasons states certain representative with the characterization of that character itself in order to explore deeper comprehension of representative.
