

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

In this chapter, the researcher gives conclusions of the result of findings and discussions. Finally, the researcher also gives some suggestion for the future researcher that interest to take topics about lexical relation.

Based on finding and analysis the data in previous chapter, the researcher made some conclusion. The conclusion relates with the outline of the research question. The researcher used Saeed's theory (1997) to analyze the types of lexical relation in *An Education's* script movie by Nick Hornby. There were *homonym*, *polysemy*, *synonym*, *antonym*, *hyponym* and *meronym*. Moreover, the words is classified which is based on the qualification in each categories of Saeed's theory about lexical relations, the researcher gave a meaning in each of words by using Cambridge Advanced Learner's Dictionary – 3rd edition, and Collins English Dictionary and Thesaurus.

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5.1.2 Conceptual meaning of words relate with lexical relation found in Nick Hornby's *An Education* movie script

Based on the discussion about the conceptual meaning: homonym, polysemy, synonym, antonym, hyponym, and meronym, they were related with lexical relation which was found on Nick Hornby's *An Education* movie script and then, the researcher give four conclusions. Firstly, all of the data are kinds of lexical relation. Secondly, homonym and polysemy have same sound or spell. But, homonym consists of two words and it is unrelated meaning while polysemy consists of a single word and it is related meaning. Thirdly, synonym refers to similar meaning while, and antonym refer to opposite meaning. Fourthly, it can represent the relationship of words on hyponym and meronym use hierarchical diagram. But, hyponym classifies the types or kinds of something while, meronym classifies the part of whole thing.

5.2 Suggestion

This topic can be applied with various subjects such as the movie script, novel, short story, and so on. Further, the researcher suggests for the future researcher to take other subjects that is not yet used before. Based on the previous explanation, the researcher limited this research to analyze six types of lexical relation by Saeed's theory. Thus, the researcher hopes that the future researcher can apply all of the types of lexical relation.
